

I then made some copies of the original key but in place of the steel contact tongue which had a tendency to bend, I fitted a spring steel tongue. These keys met with very favourable reviews from some very experienced operators and it was then that I had the idea of the adjustable spring loaded contact. I then designed my version of the PS213 the PB213. The lever of course is the heart of any key so it and its fittings are identical to the original key, but everything else on the key has been designed with a view to simplicity and ease of production, whilst hopefully retaining some 'style'.


